Short Description	<p>Elizabeth Cobbs Hoffman is the Dwight E. Stanford Chair in U.S. Foreign Relations at San Diego State University. She is a historian and novelist, and the author of several books. Professor Cobbs Hoffman currently writes articles for both scholarly and popular journals, and has served on the editorial boards of <i>Diplomatic History</i> and the <i>Encyclopedia of American Foreign Relations</i>.</p> <p>She recently served two terms as a member of the Historical Advisory Committee to the U.S. Department of State. Cobbs Hoffman has also been a member of the jury for the Pulitzer Prize in History.</p> <p>Her research interests include U.S., European, Third World, and Latin American history. In 2012-2013, Professor Cobbs Hoffman held her third fellowship at Stanford's Hoover Institution for War, Revolution, and Peace, where she just completed a new history of American foreign relations from 1776 to the present.</p> <p>Currently, Cobbs Hoffman is an active expert witness in <i>In re: Engle Progeny cases</i> as a witness for the defence. In a deposition pertaining to <i>Rodehaver v. R.J. Reynolds</i> Cobbs Hoffman declared she had made \$616,000 as an expert witness for the tobacco industry.¹</p>
