Short Description	Paul Harvey researches, writes, and teaches in the field of American history from the 16 th century to the present. His particular interests include Southern history, American religious history, popular culture, war and society, and the history of American music. Harvey is the creator of the professional scholarly blog <i>Religion in American History</i> . He is a contributor to the online journal <i>Religion Dispatches</i> . He also serves on the Board of Editors for the <i>Journal of Southern History</i> and <i>American Nineteenth Century History</i> as well as <i>Religion Compass</i> . In an expert report Harvey submitted in 2007 pertaining to <i>Alexander v. Philip Morris</i> he disclosed he charged \$250 an hour for his litigation-driven research on tobacco. ¹
