<b>Short Description</b>	Roberts is professor of History at Purdue University in Indiana. Roberts has been active as an expert witness for the defence in 25 tobacco-related court cases. Roberts has acknowledged in 2010 during a deposition pertaining to <i>In re: Engle Progeny cases</i> that he had made around \$500,000, charging \$300 hourly for his tobacco-related litigation-driven work. <sup>1</sup> In testimony given in court by Roberts in that same case in 2012 that he had made over \$900,000 as an expert witness for the tobacco industry. <sup>2</sup>
