Wayne Morgan Fellowship to facilitate the travel and research of graduate students in history. He has predominantly researched the history of American culture. He retired from UO in 1999 as George Lynn Cross Research Professor Emeritus. He passed away 29 January, 2014.</p> <p>Morgan has been involved in only one tobacco related court case: namely, the state attorney general case in Oklahoma.</p>
